Victoria: During freshman orientation studying abroad was highly touted & encourgaed. It was stated that there is a lot of money/scholarships etc to help subsidize. My daughter is enrolled for this summer; however, it seems there really is not as much financial help as we were led to believe. She has applied for what she can to no avail.

IP_Lauren: Victoria, I am sorry to hear this, summer is our most popular time to study abroad

IP_Lauren: Did she try looking for scholarships outside of our office?

IP_Lauren: Also, we have a financial aid advisor in our office, Rod Mack, who can help!

Victoria: Not sure, I will have to check with her. I think most of what she completed was through the study abroad office.

Char: On that same note, we have Fl Prepaid and Academic Bright Futures so I completed the Deferment form. Is that pretty much a given typically?

Victoria: Thank you- I will write that name down

IP_Lauren: on average, it takes close to 10 applications to recieve 1 scholarship so she will need to keep applying.

IP_Lauren: Char, Yes, Florida Prepaid and Bright Futures can be used and will be applied based on credit hours your students take

Victoria: Okay... as you obviously know they are all time consuming

Victoria: I will have her keep applying

IP_Lauren: I understand they are time consuming but hopefully she can use the same essay.

Char: I'm sure it's somewhere in the forms, but are any meals covered in the cost and how much basic necessity \$ should they take? (not counting fun money)

IP_Lauren: For Florence : Meal vouchers per week while school is in session, each worth approximately 5 Euros (10 in fall/spring; 7 in each 5 or 6 week summer session)

Victoria: It seems there are quite a few trips scheduled within the session (which is great) do they really have any other time to travel on their own or would that just basically be if they go before hand or after the session ends?

IP_Lauren: It is hard to know exactly how much to suggest- Based on past participants' feedback, a 15- to 16- week semester budget of \$3,000 - \$6,000 is needed for meals, incidental expenses in Florence, and personal travel. This \$3,000 amount is only for those who plan to live on a shoestring budget. The average estimate of student spending during the spring semester was \$4,000. The average estimate of student spending during the spring semester was \$4,000. The average estimate of student spending during a summer 6-week term is \$2,500. Many students spend more, depending especially on how much independent travel they do and how frequently they dine out. In general, you can buy a lunch for about \$8 and dinner in an inexpensive restaurant for around \$15 in Florence. • A good way to estimate what you might need in Florence is to assume that whatever you spend here in the U.S. (in dollars), you will spend the same (numerical) amount in euros. Take that dollar amount and convert to euros using the current exchange rate. • If you are planning to travel around Europe, you should expect to spend at least \$70 per day
